AVI	Audio Video Interleave, is a multimedia container format introduced by Microsoft in November 1992 as part of its Video for Windows technology. AVI files can contain both audio and video data in a file container that allows synchronous audio-with-video playback.
BMP	BMP file format, sometimes called bitmap or DIB file format (for device-independent bitmap), is an image file format used to store bitmap digital images, especially on Microsoft Windows and OS/2 operating systems.
B&W	Black and white (no color present; grayscale)
CAM	May be a shortened version for "camera" often seen used in reference to Body Cameras.
CD	Compact Disc is an optical disc used to store digital data, originally developed for storing digital audio.
CD-R	Compact Disc-Recordable is a Write Once Read Many (WORM) optical Medium.
Chap.	Chapter
DVD	"Digital Versatile Disc" or "Digital Video Disc" is a popular optical disc storage media format. Its main uses are video and data storage. DVD-R has a five-year lead on DVD+R. As such, older or cheaper DVD players (up to 2004 vintage) are more likely to favor the DVD-R standard. When creating DVDs for distribution where the playing unit is unknown or older the DVD-R format would normally be preferable.
