I. INTRODUCTION

On December 30, 2025, Georgina Home Care LLC (hereinafter “applicant”) filed an application with the Department of Transportation (hereinafter "department"), seeking authorization to operate one (1) motor vehicle having a seating capacity of ten (10) passengers or less in general livery service between all points in Connecticut from a headquarters in Bridgeport pursuant to Section 13b-103 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended.

A public hearing on the application was scheduled for March 13, 2026. Notice of the application and the hearing to be held thereon was given to the applicant and to such other parties as required pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-103, as amended. Legal notice to the public was given by publication on the department’s website.

The public hearing was held on March 13, 2026, by Sharon Peters, the hearing officer designated by the Commissioner pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-103.

At the hearing Brendaliz Jones, member of the applicant, appeared pro se. The applicant’s mailing address is 2475 North Avenue, Bridgeport, CT 06604.

Daniella Pearson appeared as a witness in support of the application.

Isabella Myricks appeared as a witness in support of the application.

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The applicant seeks to operate one (1) motor vehicle in general livery service from a headquarters in Bridgeport.
2. The applicant will operate a 2025 Chevrolet Tahoe SUV. The monthly loan payments are \$1311.29.
3. The applicant has operated Georgina Home Care LLC, a home care agency, for eight years. She also maintains a cleaning business.
4. Ms. Jones intends to provide transportation services for care givers. She will also provide services to address various client needs, such as errands.
5. The applicant will apply for Department of Social Services approval to provide transportation once the permit is granted.
6. The applicant intends to have the home care managerial employees also manage the livery business and employs a driver with the necessary license endorsement.

7. The first six months of the applicant's expenses include vehicle costs of \$7,867.74, insurance premiums of \$14,594.00, property tax of \$665.29, maintenance and repair costs of \$300.00, advertising and marketing costs of \$400.00, and communication expenses of \$720.00, for a total expense of \$24,547.03.
8. The applicant has an account balance of \$120,527.50.
9. The applicant intends to serve as a one-stop shop for clients and caregivers by providing a variety of transportation services.
10. The applicant will have a headquarters in Bridgeport where the applicant's other businesses are located at no additional cost to the applicant.
11. Ms. Jones has no criminal history.
12. This application was not opposed.

III. DISCUSSION

The department has jurisdiction over each person, association, limited liability company or corporation owning or operating a motor vehicle in livery service, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-102, as amended.

In determining whether a livery permit should be granted, the department shall take into consideration the present or future public convenience and necessity. The applicant must prove that the public's convenience and necessity will be improved by the proposed service. Additionally, the applicant must show the suitability of the applicant or the suitability of the management if the applicant is a limited liability company or corporation, the financial responsibility of the applicant, the ability of the applicant efficiently and properly to perform the service for which authority is requested and the fitness, willingness and ability of the applicant to conform to the provisions of the statutes and the requirements and regulations of the department thereunder, in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-103.

Regarding the applicant's suitability, Ms. Jones submitted a criminal record check which disclosed no criminal convictions. She has eight years of business experience. She will have her Home Care managerial employees manage this business and has hired a driver with the necessary license endorsement. Based on the evidence presented, the applicant is suitable to conduct the proposed intrastate livery business.

As far as the applicant's financial ability is concerned, the first six months of expenses include vehicle loan costs of \$7,867.74, insurance premiums of \$14,594.00, property tax of \$665.29,

maintenance and repair costs of \$300.00, advertising and marketing costs of \$400.00, and communication expenses of \$720.00, for a total expense of \$24,547. The applicant currently has \$120,527.50 in its account which is sufficient to meet these expenses.

On the issue of public convenience and necessity, the applicant has been working in the home care business and sees the need for transportation services in the state. The applicant will provide transportation for caregivers, home care clients, and is planning to obtain transportation approval from the Department of Social Services. The application was not opposed and based on the evidence presented, the applicant's service would improve public convenience and necessity. The applicant will receive authorization for one (1) general livery vehicle.

IV. ORDER

Based upon the above and pursuant to Connecticut General Statute Section 13b-103, as amended, the application in the name of Georgina Home Care LLC is hereby granted, and Livery Permit Number 3884 is hereby issued as follows:

LIVERY PERMIT NUMBER 3884

Georgina Home Care LLC is authorized to operate one (1) motor vehicle with a seating capacity of ten (10) passengers or less in general livery service, between all points in Connecticut from a headquarters in Bridgeport.

RESTRICTIONS:

The applicant must register and insure the motor vehicle granted in this decision within thirty (30) days. Failure to do so may result in revocation of the general livery authority.

The authority granted under this permit may not be sold or transferred until it has been operational, i.e. a vehicle registered with livery plates thereunder for not less than twenty-four (24) months from the date of this final decision. If at any time during the twenty-four (24) month period the applicant enters into a contract for sale and transfer of any of the vehicles authorized under application 2512-N-136-L, the authority granted herein shall be revoked. This permit is transferable only with the approval of the Department.

This permit shall remain in effect until it is amended, suspended or revoked by the department. Failure of the permit holder to maintain proper insurance and/or comply with all pertinent motor vehicle laws and other state statutes and/or rules, regulations and orders of the department shall be considered sufficient cause to amend, suspend or revoke said permit.
