



By His Excellency Ned Lamont, Governor: an
Official Statement

WHEREAS, in June 1935, the Connecticut General Assembly passed into law Senate Bill 101, which led to the establishment of the Connecticut Tumor Registry; and

WHEREAS, the Connecticut Tumor Registry, in the State of Connecticut Department of Public Health, is the nation's first population-based cancer registry and has been a national leader in cancer surveillance and research for nine decades; and

WHEREAS, the Connecticut Tumor Registry plays a vital role in the collection, analysis, and dissemination of cancer data that informs public health strategies, supports life-saving research, and guides improvements in cancer prevention, diagnosis, and treatment; and

WHEREAS, the Connecticut Tumor Registry has partnered with hospitals, healthcare providers, and public health institutions across Connecticut and the United States to ensure high-quality, comprehensive cancer data; and

WHEREAS, the enduring work of the Connecticut Tumor Registry has contributed to advances in cancer research and control and has helped improve outcomes for countless individuals and families affected by cancer; and

WHEREAS, the State of Connecticut recognizes the dedication and expertise of the registry's staff, past and present, whose commitment to excellence has made this milestone possible; and

WHEREAS, the 90th anniversary of the Connecticut Tumor Registry is an opportunity to honor its legacy and reaffirm our shared commitment to reducing the burden of cancer through data, science, and collaboration; now

THEREFORE, I, Ned Lamont, Governor of the State of Connecticut, do hereby officially proclaim June 3rd, 2025, as

in the State of Connecticut and encourage all residents to recognize the critical contributions of the Connecticut Tumor Registry to public health and the fight against cancer.
