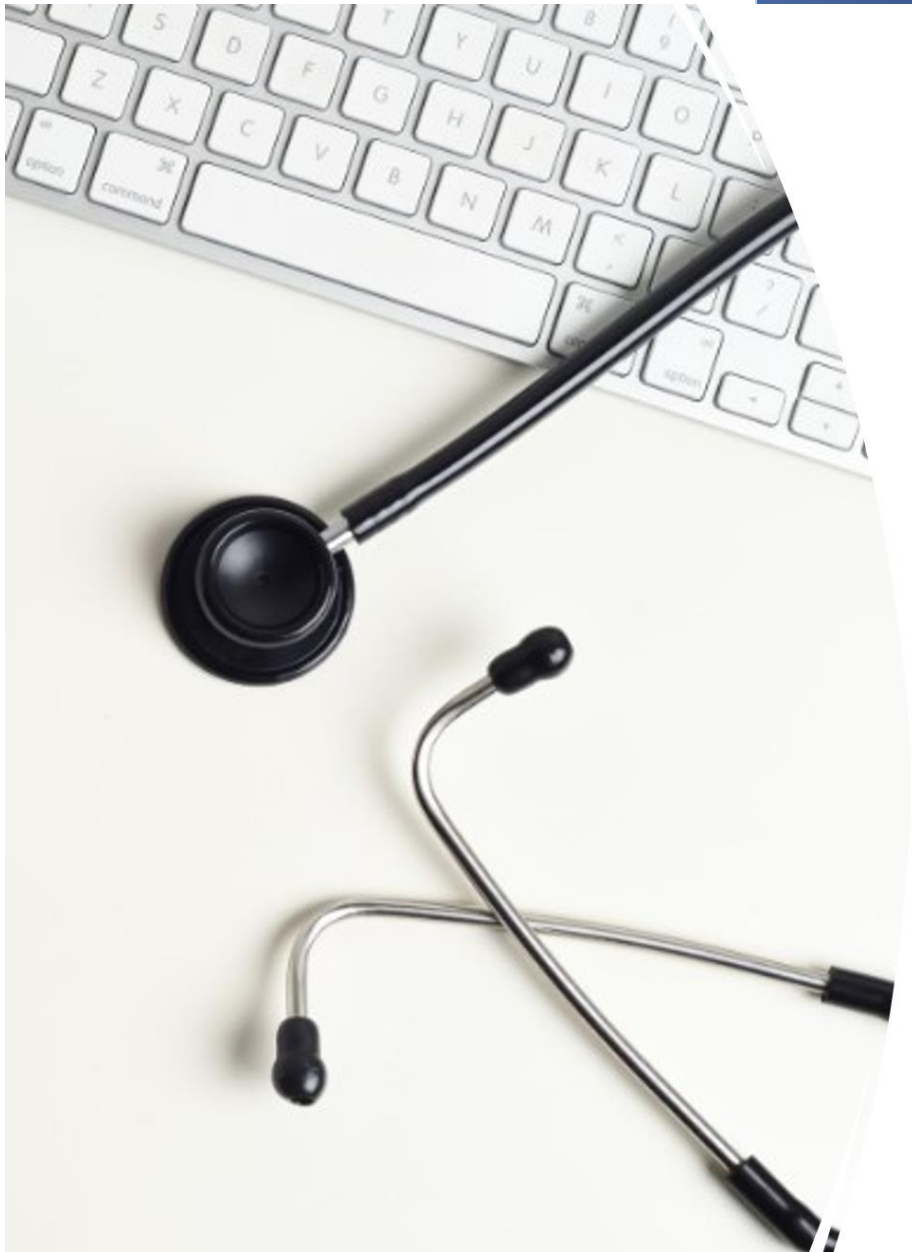




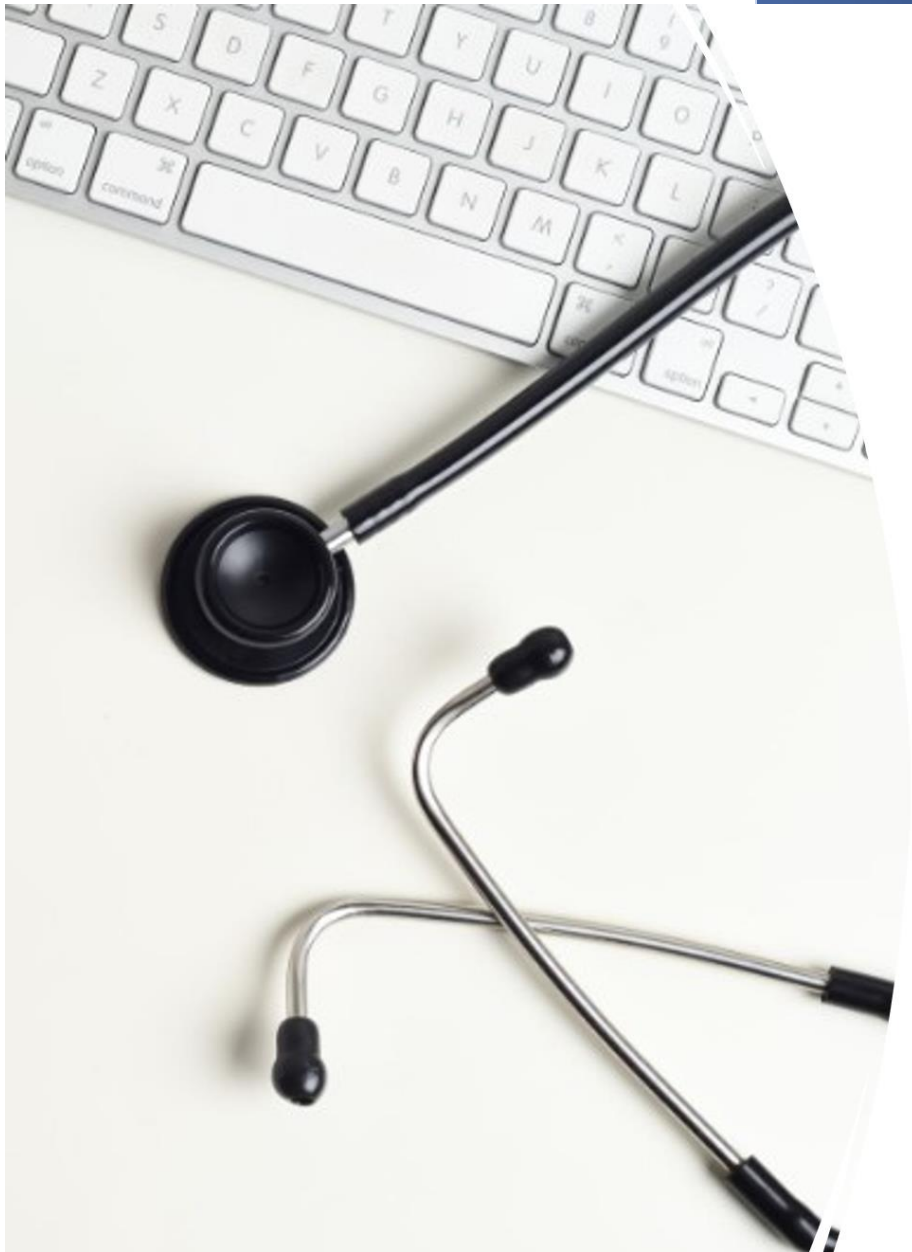

# Program Overview

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The Connecticut Essential Workers COVID -19 Assistance Fund, authorized by the legislature last year, was launched in January to help ease the financial burden for essential workers who lived in Connecticut, contracted COVID-19, became ill and were unable to work, or died, between March 10, 2020 and July 20, 2021.



# Program Overview (continued)

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The Office of the State Comptroller (OSC) oversees the \$34-million fund and, through an RFP process, selected Public Consulting Group (PCG) as the third party administrator.

Eligible essential workers can apply for benefits to cover:

- Lost wages
- Out-of-pocket medical
- Burial expenses

# Coming Soon: 2022 CT Premium Pay Program

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OSC is immediately preparing to implement a new additional \$30-million program to provide additional financial relief to essential workers, regardless of whether they contracted COVID-19.

Eligibility: Any 1a or 1b nongovernment worker who worked during the entire period of the emergency declaration from March 10, 2020 through the effective date of the legislation (May 7, 2022), did NOT work remotely or could not have, and meet the income criteria.
