# Overview of The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- The FAFSA is administered by the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Federal Student Aid; CT students can receive up to ~\$20,000 in aid in federal and state aid
- In order to be eligible for financial aid, students must fill out the FAFSA -- this includes federal grants (Pell Grants, work-study, loans), most college-based aid, and state grants like Roberta Willis Scholarship Program
- Per the National College Attainment Network, there is an 84% increase in likelihood of postsecondary enrollment associated with FAFSA completion.






# Why is the FAFSA so important for Connecticut students?

A growing share of Connecticut students rely on Pell Grants, or federal grants reserved for students who display exceptional financial need, to finance their higher education.

And there are likely more who could benefit. Research shows that one-third of the students who do not file a FAFSA would have been eligible for a Pell grant and other need-based aid.

#### **Vision**

# Mini Grants to 40 Schools EdSight Data Dashboard External partnerships (FAFSACT.org)

Mini Grants: Each school receives between \$5,000 - \$12,000 to implement innovative strategies and incentives for students to submit a FAFSA

<u>Data Dashboard:</u> CSDE posts FAFSA weekly completion rates on a district, school, and, through a secure portal, individual level

**External Partnerships:** CSDE established partnerships with the RISE Network, CTCollegeBound, and the College Advising Corps to expand capacity for and deepen knowledge of FAFSA completion strategies in high-need schools.

#### What success looks like



90% of Challenge schools (up to 36 schools) will increase their FAFSA completion rates by 5 percentage points or more



A statewide completion goal of 60%, or an increase of roughly 5 points from June 2021
