"Female genital mutilation (FGM) comprises all procedures that involve partial or total removal of the external female genitalia, or other injury to the female genital organs for non-medical reasons."








## FGM/C in the U.S.

**513,000 or more** women and girls in the United States had FGM/C performed on them or were at risk of FGM/C in 2012.



State-by-State Estimates of Girls and Women at Risk for FGM/C (2019) Compared to Previous PRB Estimates (2013)

## FGM/C in Connecticut


- Connecticut ranks 26th in the nation for at-risk populations, totaling 2,658.
- 1,128 of those girls are under the age of 18, according to the Population Reference Bureau.
- 41 states have laws, <u>Connecticut is one of the</u> <u>remaining 9 states that do not.</u>








#### FGM/C in Connecticut by County

## **U.S. Federal Law**

#### 18 U.S. Code § 116 - Female genital mutilation

U.S. Code

Notes

prev | next

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), whoever, in any circumstance described in subsection (d), knowingly—
  - (1) performs, attempts to perform, or conspires to perform <u>female genital mutilation</u> on another person who has not attained the age of 18 years;
  - (2) being the parent, guardian, or caretaker of a person who has not attained the age of 18 years facilitates or consents to the female genital mutilation of such person; or
  - (3) transports a person who has not attained the age of 18 years for the purpose of the performance of female genital mutilation on such person,

shall be fined under this title, imprisoned not more than 10 years, or both.



## **State Laws Remain Critical**

- We know anecdotally that families on the fence or resisting having their children undergo the procedure, but facing pressure from family or community members to do so, use the law as the reason for why they will not cut their children.
- State laws fill gaps left by federal laws. Comprehensive state legislation provides education and outreach on FGM/C to local communities and professionals likely to encounter cases, and gives survivors the opportunity to stand up for themselves in a court of law.
- A state law gives state prosecutors more leeway in the event the Department of Justice cannot or will not prosecute.



## **Connecticut Coalition to End FGM/C**

- We are a survivor-led coalition working to ensure that the State of Connecticut joins with 41 other states - including its neighboring states of New York, Rhode Island, and Massachusetts - to prohibit female genital mutilation and cutting of minors.
- In Connecticut, 39 organizations have joined the Connecticut Coalition to End FGM/C. The Coalition has been working with survivors, organizations, advocates, and lawmakers to pass a holistic, comprehensive bill that prohibits FGM/C in Connecticut.
