Dear healthcare providers,

Below are some updates to ACIP recommendations for the use of COVID-19 vaccines. We expect the full, published recommendations to be available in the coming months [here](#). You can sign up to receive updates directly from Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on the site.

On Tuesday September 12, the ACIP voted to recommend the updated COVID-19 vaccine to everyone 6 months and older. The CDC press release can be accessed [here](#).

- Everyone aged 6 years and oldershould get **1 updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine** to be up to date, regardless of whether they've received any original COVID-19 vaccines.
- People aged 65 years and oldermay get a 2nd dose of updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.
- People who are moderately or severely immunocompromisedmay get additional doses of updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.
- Children aged 6 months–5 yearsmay need multiple doses of COVID-19 vaccine to be up to date, including at least 1 dose of updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, depending on the number of doses they've previously received and their age.
- COVID-19 vaccine recommendations will be updated as needed.

Implementation and plans for monitoring safety and effectiveness

- We will share more information regarding the availability of COVID-19 vaccines for children aged 18 and younger through the CVP in the coming days.
- We expect commercialized or private sector vaccines to be available to the public within the next 48 hours.
- COVID-19 vaccine storage and handling will be the same as it is now.
 - [Moderna](#) can be stored frozen between -50°C and -15°C (-58°F and 5°F) until expiration or in a refrigerator between 2°C and 8°C (36°F and 46°F) for up to 30 days
 - [Pfizer](#) can be stored at ultra-cold temperatures between -90°C and -60°C (-130°F and -76°F) until expiration or in a refrigerator between 2°C and 8°C (36°F and 46°F) for up to 10 weeks
- COVID-19 vaccines can be administered simultaneously with other vaccines.
- CDC will continue to monitor safety and effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccines by leveraging existing vaccine effectiveness platforms.
