The soil stockpile located adjacent to the staging area near the Metro North Railroad in Milford has been covered with a tarp for further containment.



Conduit was being pulled through the second boring at the Metro North Railroad Crossing in Milford. Catch basin will still need attention.



Perimeter barrier controls remain in place around the staging area at the Metro North Railroad Crossing in Milford. Continue to adjust as necessary.



Electrical contrator was installing conduit banks at sta. #441, connecting/tying-in to the conduit sleeves attached to the bridge deck at Sasco Creek.
