Pursuant to Condition No. 1 of the Council's Decision on February 21, 2017, your request to perform work on Sunday, June 2, 2019 from 9:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at Southington Substation is hereby approved. The extended work hours are necessary to change the existing temporary bypass transformer configuration to a permanent configuration during a scheduled outage. The work will be performed within the control house and security fence of the substation.

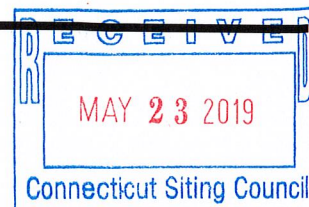

Eversource is requesting approval from Connecticut Siting Council staff for Sunday work hours (9:30 a.m. to 6 p.m.) on June 2 for work in the Southington Substation. The reason for this request is to change the existing temporary by-pass transformer configuration to a permanent configuration within the scheduled outage. This work hours on Sunday are to avoid or minimize the risk of customer outages that could occur as a result of a "Single Contingency Loss of Load event" on the system during the reconfiguration. The work will be performed within the control house and security fence of the substation.
