

Comments of Rep. Mary Mushinsky (85th) Before the CT Siting Council Regarding Petition #1339 for a Declaratory Ruling by Wallingford Renewable Energy LLC Requesting the Council's Approval and Construction of a 19.99 MW AC Ground Mounted PV System

March 9, 2018

I am in general support of this solar project in Wallingford, which re-uses our old landfill and adds clean energy generation to the grid, but I recently learned the project footprint extends beyond the landfill. I ask the Siting Council to consider two specific siting problems and see if they can be resolved before you issue a Declaratory Ruling.


First, because the project needs 100 acres to produce 20 MW of power, the applicant proposes covering not only the old landfill (north parcel) with solar panels, but also destroying adjacent, high quality deciduous forest and a portion of the palustrine forested-flood plain forest on the MIRA property (south parcel) to add more solar panels. Second, the project may interfere with Phase IV of the Quinnipiac River Linear Trail, a local pedestrian and bicycle greenway. These are undesirable impacts that I hope the Siting Council will address before you allow this project to go forward.


There are no obvious problems with solar on the former landfill (north parcel). However, solar installation on the MIRA property (south parcel), while avoiding wetlands, will clear 20 acres of river corridor forest to squeeze in more units. Figure 26 in the application shows removal of high quality deciduous forest in three sections and destruction of a portion of the very limited palustrine forested-floodplain forest, a critical habitat that is rare in Connecticut. Must we destroy high quality deciduous forest and disappearing critical habitat just to enlarge this project? Can't we reduce the size of the project by 20 acres, or add solar units on nearby degraded industrial land instead of destroying critical habitat?

The second problem is that the applicant does not mention the Quinnipiac River Linear Trail Phase IV which is planned to pass through this area on its way to North Haven. The trail already extends 2.25 miles along the Quinnipiac River because phases I-III are built. The trail committee

works with the town engineer and the committee anticipated we would be able to use a portion of government-owned land for Phase IV. Please see the attachments which depict maps of the entire trail route and Phase IV. Can the Siting Council consider the needs of the public who will use the trail corridor and request that the applicant take this into consideration?
