

1. Manner in which intervenor's participation is in the interests of justice and will not impair the orderly conduct of the proceedings:

The #SmartSolarCT team would like to offer to the Council a third-party review of the plans and design of the solar array proposed in Petition 1385. It has come to our attention that the plans resemble the faulty design of the solar array that was installed in East Lyme in 2014, resulting in damage to wetlands and streams. We would like to discuss the possibilities of adverse environmental impact by this proposed installation and remedies, if possible.

2. Manner and extent to which intervenor proposes to participate:

We would like to have a public hearing in the town of Old Lyme. And we would like to participate in interrogatories with the Petitioner to further the Council's understanding of the possible adverse environmental impacts of this solar array as it is currently designed.

4. Nature of evidence intervenor intends to present:

We would like to present expertise from Professional Engineers and Biologists about the potential for adverse impacts caused by the design of the solar array as proposed in Petition 1385.
