The United Illuminating Company ("UI") hereby provides copies of correspondence from the State Historic Preservation Office ("SHPO") and the Connecticut Department of Energy & Environmental Protection ("DEEP").

After a review of the proposed project, the SHPO concluded on March 18, 2015, that "[n]o historic properties will be affected by this project." See Attachment A.

UI also prepared and submitted an application to DEEP for a "General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater and Dewatering Wastewaters from Construction Activities." Following DEEP's review of the application, DEEP provided a letter to UI stating that the project "is compliant with the requirements of the general permit and the discharge(s) associated with this project are authorized to commence." The Historic Preservation Review Process in Connecticut Cultural Resource Review under the National Historic Preservation Act – Section 106 http://www.achp.gov/106summary.html involves providing technical guidance and professional advice on the potential impact of publicly funded, assisted, licensed or permitted projects on the state's historic, architectural and archaeological resources. This responsibility of the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) is discharged in two steps: (1) identification of significant historic, architectural and archaeological resources; and (2) advisory assistance to promote compatibility between new development and preservation of the state's cultural heritage.

Project review is conducted in two stages. First, the SHPO assesses affected properties to determine whether or not they are listed or eligible for listing in the Connecticut State or National Registers of Historic Places. If so, it is deemed "historic" and worthy of protection and the second stage of review is undertaken. The project is reviewed to evaluate its impact on the properties significant materials and character. Where adverse effects are identified, alternatives are explored to avoid, or reduce project impacts; where this is unsuccessful, mitigation measures are developed and formal agreement documents are prepared stipulating these measures. PERMIT AUTHORIZATION:

The Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, Water Permitting and Enforcement Division of the Bureau of Materials Management and Compliance Assurance, has completed the review of the Hawthorne Substation (located at 180 Hawthorne Dr) registration for the General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater and Dewatering Wastewaters from Construction Activities, effective 10/1/13 (general permit). The project is compliant with the requirements of the general permit and the discharge(s) associated with this project is (are) authorized to commence as of the date of this letter. Permit No. GSN002865 has been assigned to authorize the stormwater discharge(s) from this project.

Section 5(c)(1)(A) requires the permittee to submit Stormwater Monitoring Reports when there is discharge of stormwater from the site. The general permit requires electronic submission of sampling results through NetDMR web-based reporting system within 180 days of this authorization, in accordance with Section 5(c)(2)(F) of this general permit. On or before ninety (90) days after receipt of this letter, the permittee shall submit the CT DEEP NetDMR Subscribers Agreement. Download the instruction and Subscriber Agreement form at www.ct.gov/deep/netdmr. Please read the instructions before completing the form. For help or questions about the NetDMR process contact Sharon Yurasevecz at (860) 424-3861 or sharon.yurasevecz@ct.gov. Once your Subscriber Agreement is approved the signatory authority will be notified, by email, to create an account in NetDMR at which time the permittee is required to terminate paper monitoring reports and initiate the electronic reports. You may create an account at any time, however your role and access to your permit will not be granted until you have submitted a sufficient CT DEEP NetDMR Subscriber Agreement. Sampling shall be conducted in accordance with 40CFR part 136 and shall continue until final stabilization of the

drainage area associated with each outfall is achieved. Final stabilization is determined in accordance with Section 6 of the General permit.
