RE: **DOCKET NO. 424** - The Connecticut Light & Power Company Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the Connecticut portion of the Interstate Reliability Project that traverses the municipalities of Lebanon, Columbia, Coventry, Mansfield, Chaplin, Hampton, Brooklyn, Pomfret, Killingly, Putnam, Thompson, and Windham, which consists of (a) new overhead 345-kV electric transmission lines and associated facilities extending between CL&P's Card Street Substation in the Town of Lebanon, Lake Road Switching Station in the Town of Killingly, and the Connecticut/Rhode Island border in the Town of Thompson; and (b) related additions at CL&P's existing Card Street Substation, Lake Road Switching Station, and Killingly Substation.

Dear Mr. Morissette:

Pursuant to a decision made in accordance with R.C.S.A. §16-50j-62 (b) at public meetings of the Connecticut Siting Council (Council) held on October 17, 2013 and October 31, 2013, and in response to your email of April 29, 2014, Council staff hereby approves changes to the Development and Management (D&M) Plans to allow construction activities associated with the above project to occur within a twelve-hour period, Monday through Saturday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

This approval applies only to change to work hours proposed in your email request on April 29, 2014. Any additional changes to the D&M Plans require advance notification and approval in accordance with the Council's approval of the D&M Plans on October 17, 2013 and October 31, 2013. Furthermore, the Certificate Holder is responsible for reporting requirements pursuant to Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies Section 16-50j-62.

Please be advised that deviations from this plan are enforceable under the provisions of the Connecticut General Statutes § 16-50u.

Good morning Melanie and Christina:

CL&P hereby requests Connecticut Siting Council (Council) staff approval of a Development and Management (D&M) Plan Change for the extended work hours described below pursuant to Sections 4 and 7.2 of the Interstate Reliability Project (Project) D&M Plan for Modifications to the Card Street Substation, Lake Road Switching Station, and Killingly Substation and the D&M Plan for the New 345-kV Transmission Line and Related Minor Modifications to Adjacent Lines.

Accordingly, CL&P seeks Council staff approval for work beyond the 10 hour limit to finish a concrete pour for a foundation. Our foundation contractor, Tri-State, is working on the foundation for structure 272 today in Killingly. Tri-State is currently planning on pouring concrete this afternoon, however, they have also notified us that there is a possibility that work will be extended beyond the allowed 10-hr window. Work is expected to be finished by 7:00 PM.

The Project's Community Relations team will perform outreach to inform the property owner and the towns. This outreach will occur this afternoon.

In addition, since the Project continues to find the need to work beyond the 10 hour work limit, CL&P is seeking staff approval to the change in typical Construction Work Window from Monday - Saturday 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM, with no restrictions on work hour limits.
