

# Stay Up to Date with the PHE Unwinding

## Summary

This month, notifications went out to the first group of HUSKY Health members on a PHE extension to let them know if they failed the passive renewal process and that their renewal is due at the end of April. This is also the first month that SNAP recipients will not receive an emergency allotment. Finally, the Update Us So We Can Update U campaign has wrapped up and we look forward to evaluating its success. The website remains active.

## What's New This Week?



This week, we've begun to see some of the direct impacts of the PHE Unwinding on Connecticut residents. This includes...

### HUSKY Renewal



The first group of HUSKY Health members who have been active due to the PHE Continuous Enrollment requirement received notifications this month letting them know if they were successfully renewed or if they must complete a renewal by April 30, 2023.

Our partner CHNCT sent ~17,000 automated emails and calls to members who must complete their renewal by April 30, 2023.

### No SNAP Emergency Allotments



March was the first month in which SNAP recipients no longer received an extra SNAP emergency allotment. This impacts over 225,000 households.
