
# How to Create a Video Component (Content Editor) Part 1.

#### Introduction

The Video Component features an embedded video from a streaming source such as YouTube or Vimeo. The video source must be configured to allow for public access and accessibility considerations such as captioning. For this example, we will be creating Video Components for a 4x4x4 Sub layout.


#### Step 1

Locate the "\_resources" box and right click it. Click "Insert". Then click "Video Component Folder".




### Step 2

Right-click the Video Component Folder, click "Insert" and click "Video Component". In the pop-up that appears, give the Video Component a unique name and click "OK".




Click on the "Video Component", and in the right panel, fill in the details. First, fill in the Video Title.




## Step 5

Next, go to the "Video" section and click inside the field. Determine where you are using the video resource from. If you are using videos from publishing sites like YouTube or Vimeo, insert the embed code that those sites provide in their "Share" option.




Next, click in the "Display Styles" field and make sure that "Version 2" is selected.




# Step 7


The Video Component is now complete. Immediately click on the "Save" button in the top left corner of the Sitecore Content Editor to SAVE YOUR WORK. Next, go to the "Publish" tab. Click on "Publish Content".



Now that you have created your first Video Component, you can now proceed to create the other 2 needed for this 4x4x4 Sub layout example, just follow steps 2-7 of this lesson.

Keep in mind, there is an important factor to consider when creating and using this component, Video Components are meant to spread evenly across blades on a page, this means when using this component, the sub layout options that are given are 3x3x3x3 (4 videos across). 4x4x4 (3 videos across) and 6x6 (2 videos across).







# How to Create Feature Content Cards (Experience Editor) Part 2.


### Step 1

Click the page you are working on in the Content Editor and inside the "Publish" tab to open the "Experience Editor". Once the new browser tab has opened, wait for the Experience Editor page to load.




### Step 2

Click in the empty box and select "4x4x4 Sub-layout" in the pop-up that appears and click "Select". Click "Add here". Select on the "4x4x4 Sub layout" option for this example. As you will see, the blade container has now divided into 3 equal rectangles across the page.




Click inside the first container placeholder, click "Add here". Select "Video Component" in the pop-up. Click on the "VIDEO COMPONENT" image. Click "Select".




# Step 4

In this new pop-up, expand the "Video Component Folder" you previously created in the Content Editor. Click the first "Video Component". Your Video Component should be visible and resemble the example shown below. Select the first Video component and click "OK".




Once the first component has completed loading into the first space, please follow Steps 2-4 of this lesson to load the second and third video components.




# Step 6

After you have completed inserting all 3 video components, your page in the Experience Editor should resemble the example provided below.



Immediately click the Disc icon to SAVE YOUR WORK in the Experience Editor. WAIT FOR THE PAGE TO RE-LOAD. Once the page has reloaded, it should resemble the image displayed below, and the SAVE icon image should be grayed out meaning that your save is in the latest version.



# Step 8

Once you have completed editing the "Experience Editor", you can now return to the "Content Editor" in Sitecore, most likely, in the previous browser tab. Click once again on the Video Component Child page, and only then proceed to the "SAVE" icon in the "Content Editor". Finally, click "Publish Content".
