

How to Create Lead Feature Story Cards (Content Editor) – Part 1

Purpose:

The Lead Feature Story Card highlights the most important story on a page. It gives customers a clear summary of what they'll find as they scroll. This card includes:

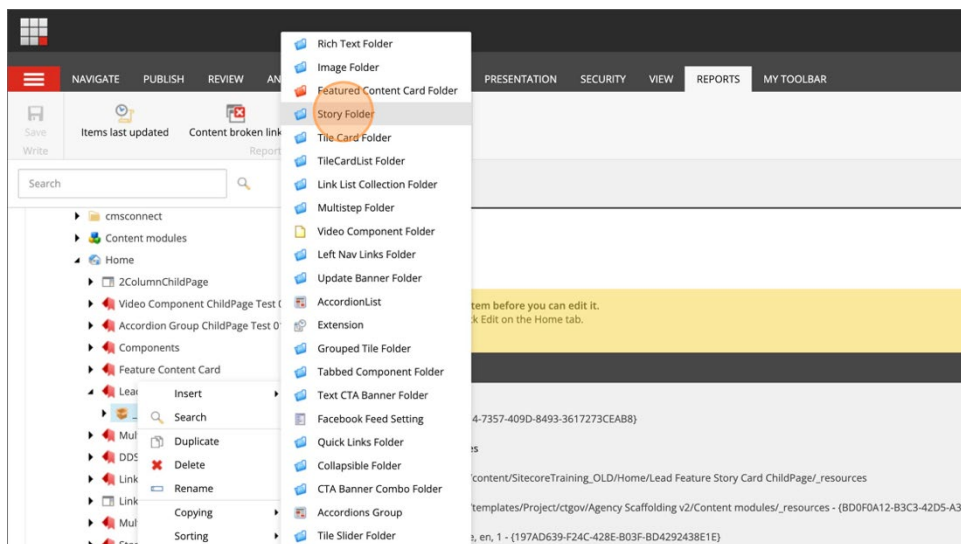
- Title
- Body Copy
- Image or Video
- Optional Call-to-Action (CTA) Link

Important: This guide covers only the **Content Editor** part 1 steps for *creating* a Lead Feature Story Card.

To **add the component to your page**, you **must complete Part 2** using the **Experience Editor**. **Don't stop here! Be sure to continue to Part 2** to finish the process.

Step 1: Create a Story Folder

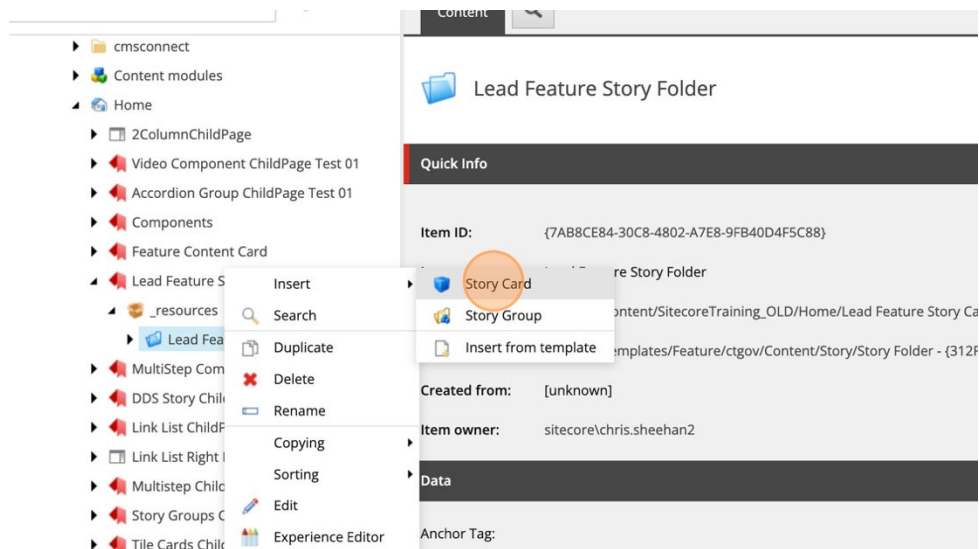
1. In the Content Editor, locate the "_resources" folder under your page
2. Right click "_resources" > Insert > Story Folder.



3. Give your Story Card folder a **unique name** (we'll call this one Lead Feature Story Folder) and click **OK**.

Step 2: Insert a Story Card

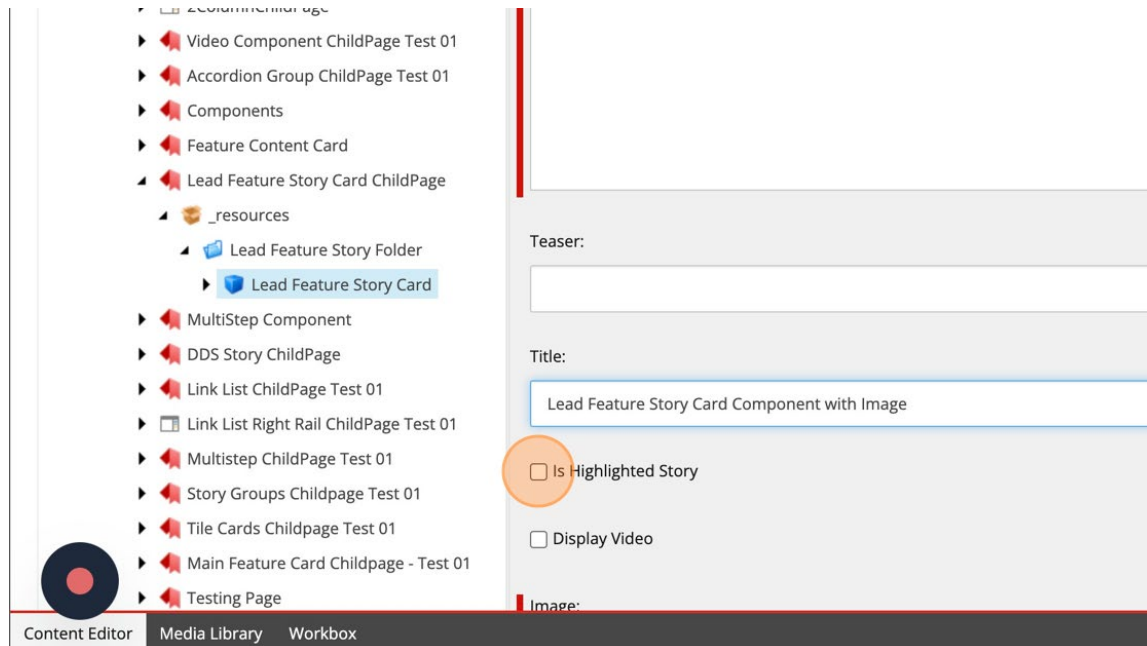
1. Right-click the new **Story Folder** (ours is called Lead Feature Story Folder).
2. Choose **Insert > Story Card**.



3. Give your Story Card a **unique name** (we'll call this one Lead Feature Story Card) and click **OK**.

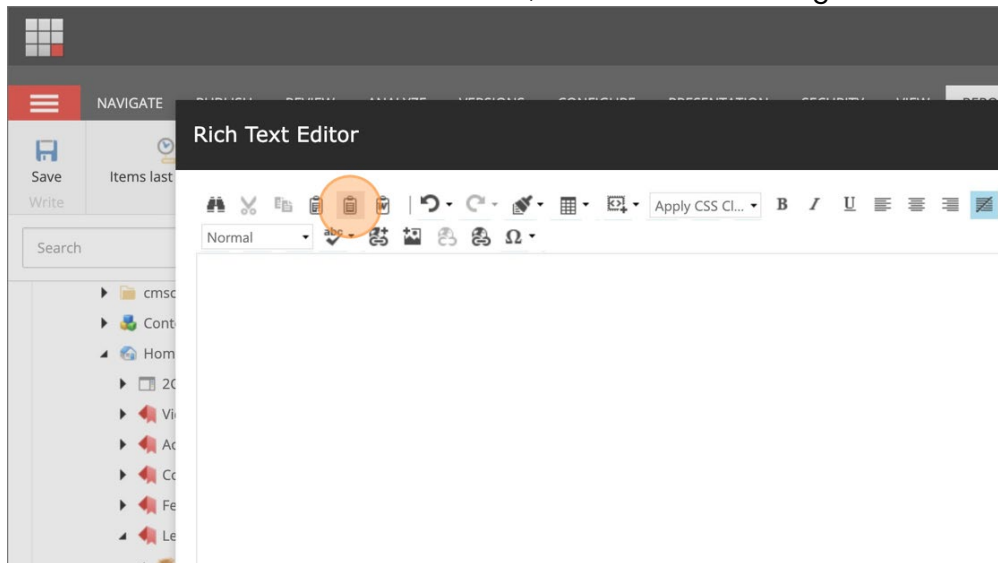
Step 3: Add Title and Highlight Option

1. Click on the new **Lead Feature Story Card**.
2. In the **Title** field, enter a clear and concise headline that includes relevant keywords for your page. Including relevant keywords helps improve search visibility and gives customers a quick understanding of the content.
3. Check the box for **Is Highlighted Story** to designate it as the lead.



Step 4: Add a Description

1. In the **Description** field, click **Show Editor** to open the Rich Text Editor.
2. Enter **plain, unformatted text only** — no bold, colors, or headings.
 - If you're copying from another source:
 - Use **Paste as Plain Text**
 - **Shortcut:** Press **Ctrl+Shift+V** (Windows) or **Cmd+Shift+V** (Mac)
 - Or **right-click** and choose "**Paste as plain text**"
 - Recommended for clean, consistent formatting



Tip: If you need to keep basic formatting from Microsoft Word (like bold text or bullet points), click the **clipboard with the “W” icon** in the editor toolbar. This allows you to safely paste content from Word without carrying over unwanted styles.

3. Click **Accept** when you're done.

Step 5: Add a Link

You can add one of three types of links:

- **Insert Link** – For internal pages
- **Insert Media Link** – For files in the Media Library
- **Insert External Link** – For outside websites

Accessibility Tip:

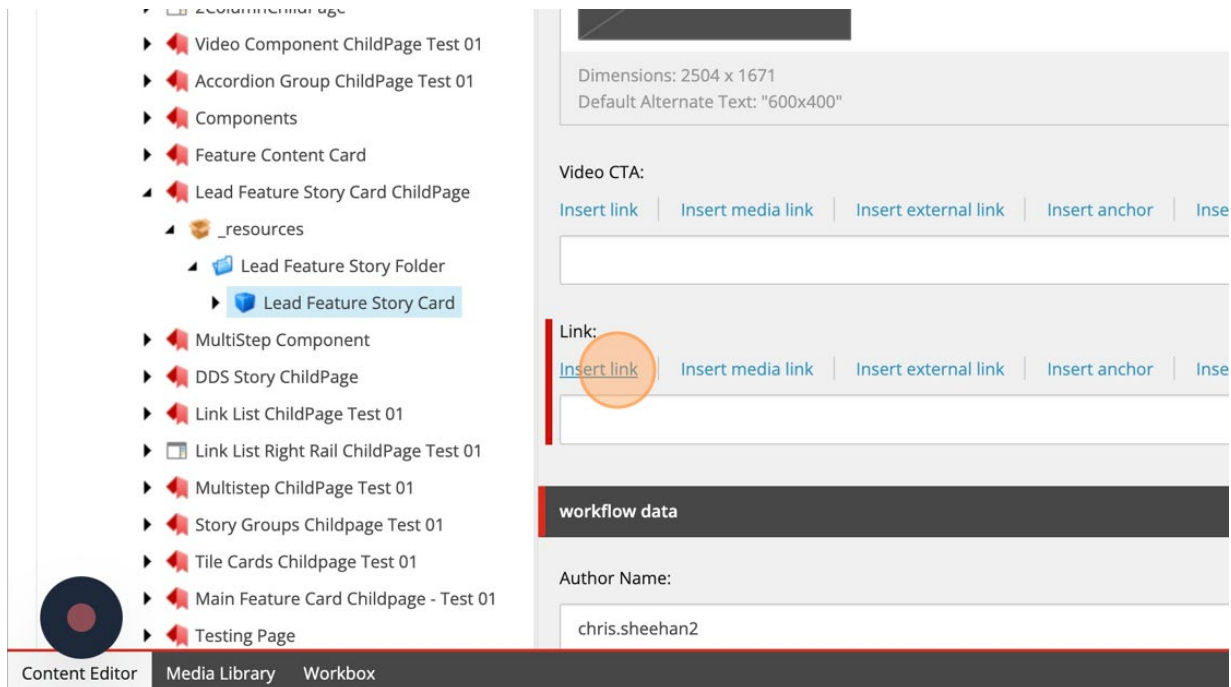
When adding a link, always include **descriptive link text** that clearly tells the user where the link will go — **never use** generic phrases like “Click here” or “Read more.”

Instead, use meaningful text such as:

- ✓ [Learn more about our sustainability efforts](#)
- ✓ [Download the 2025 program guide \(PDF\)](#)

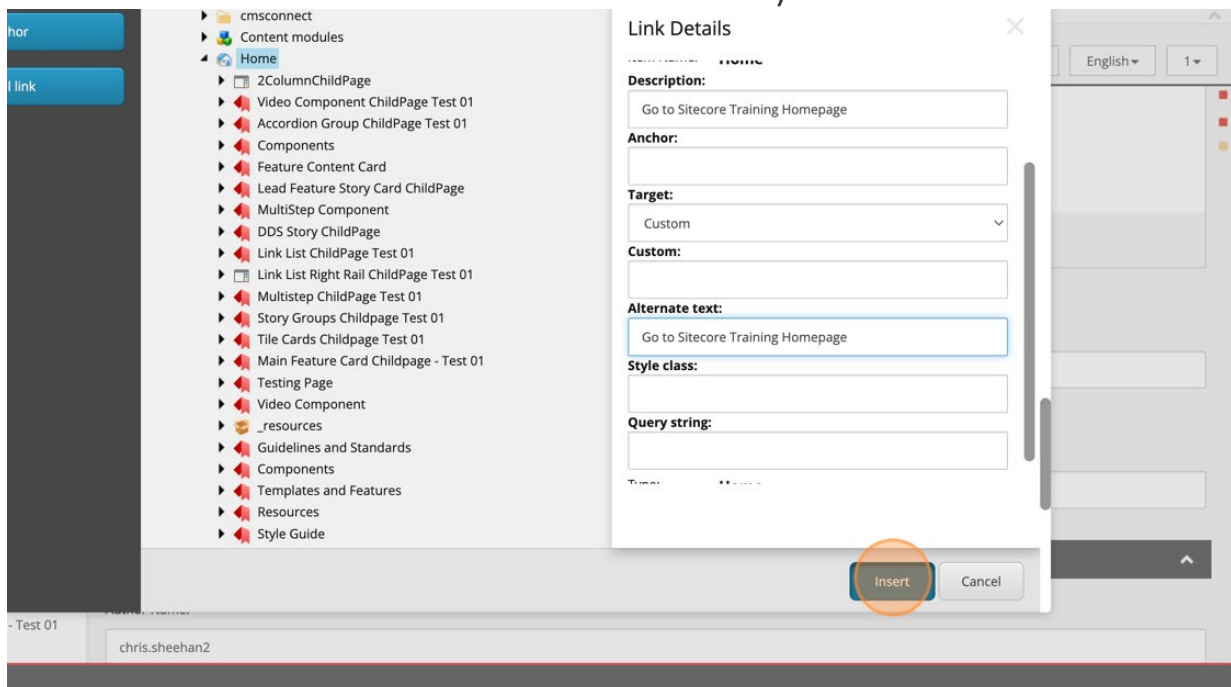
Also, fill in the **Alternative Text** field in the Link Details to support screen reader users.

1. Click the **Links** field and choose the link type.



2. In the **Link Details** window:

- Choose the target page or file
- Add a **Description**
- Choose **Active Browser**
- Add **Alternative Text** for accessibility

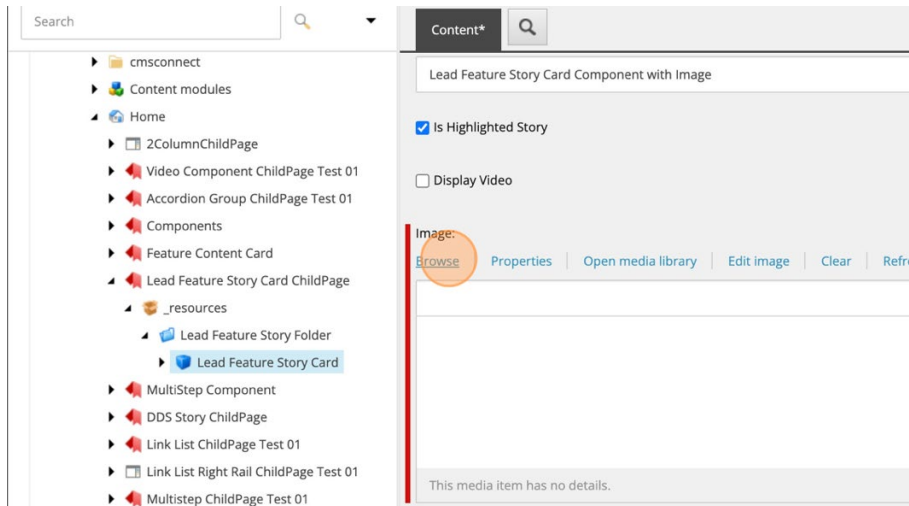


Step 6: Add an Image

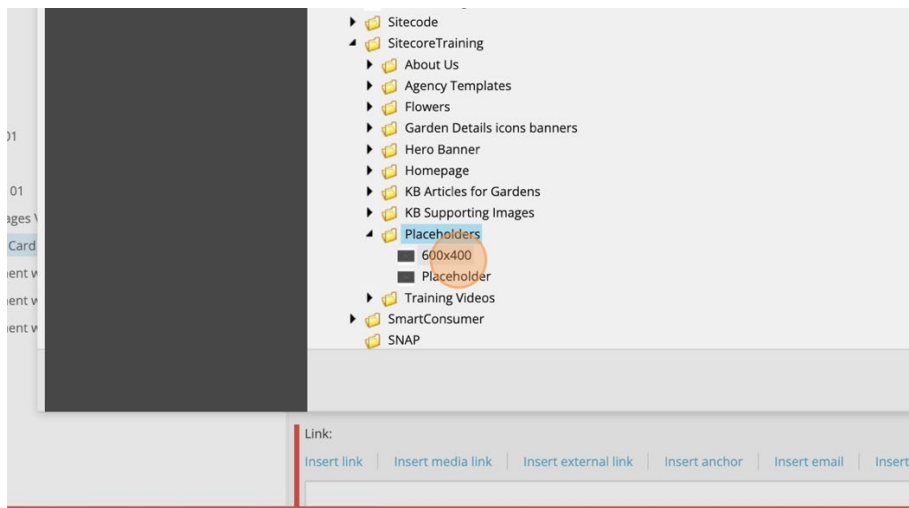
1. In the **Image** field, click **Browse**.

Image requirements:

- 600x400px
- 72 dpi

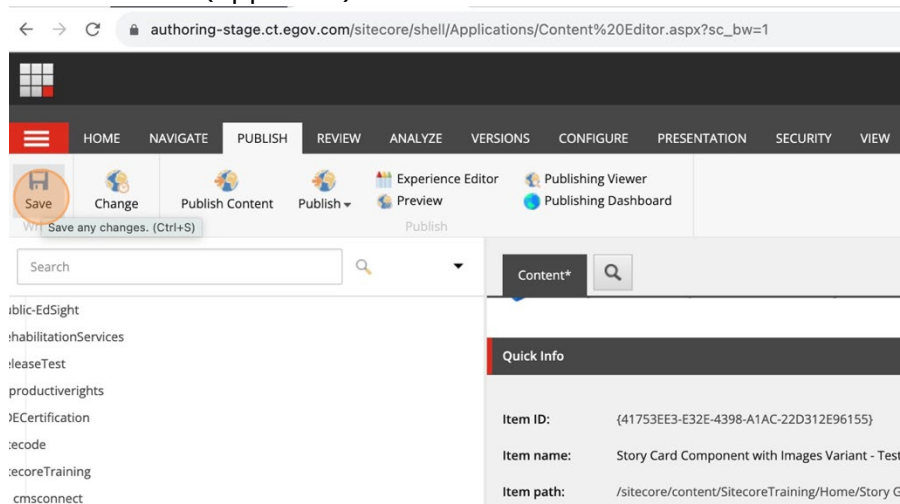


2. Select the appropriate image from the **Media Library**.
3. Click **Insert**.

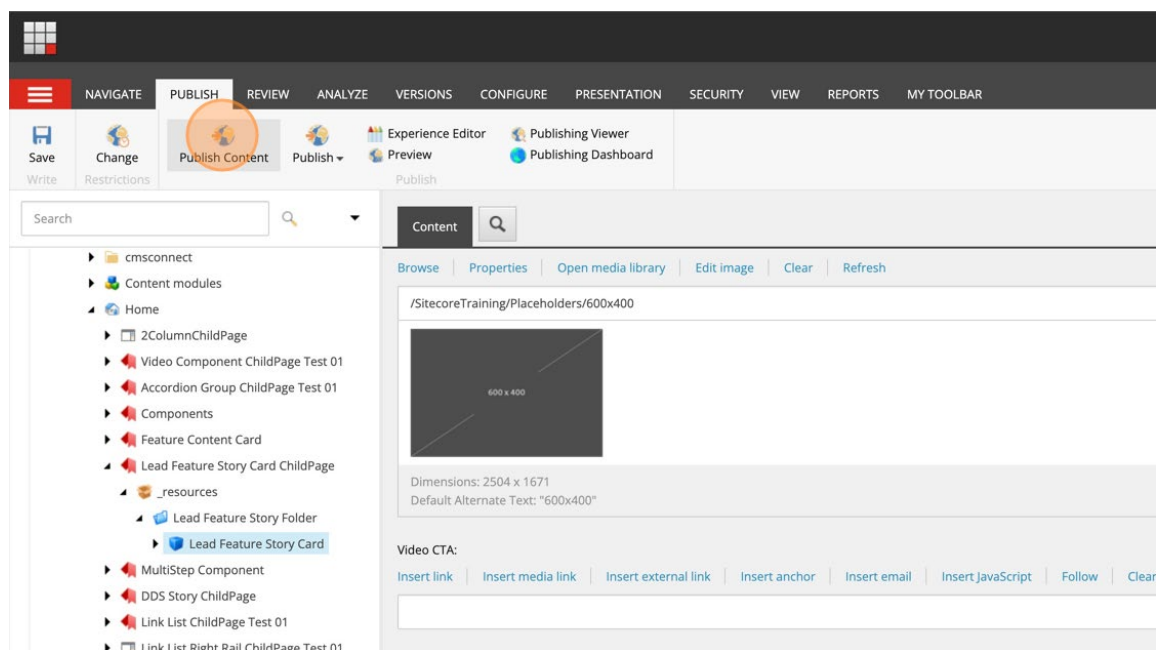


Step 7: Save and Publish

1. Click **Save** (upper left)



2. From the ribbon, click the publish tab, then **Publish Content** to publish the Story Card.

How to Create Lead Feature Story Cards (Experience Editor) — Part 2

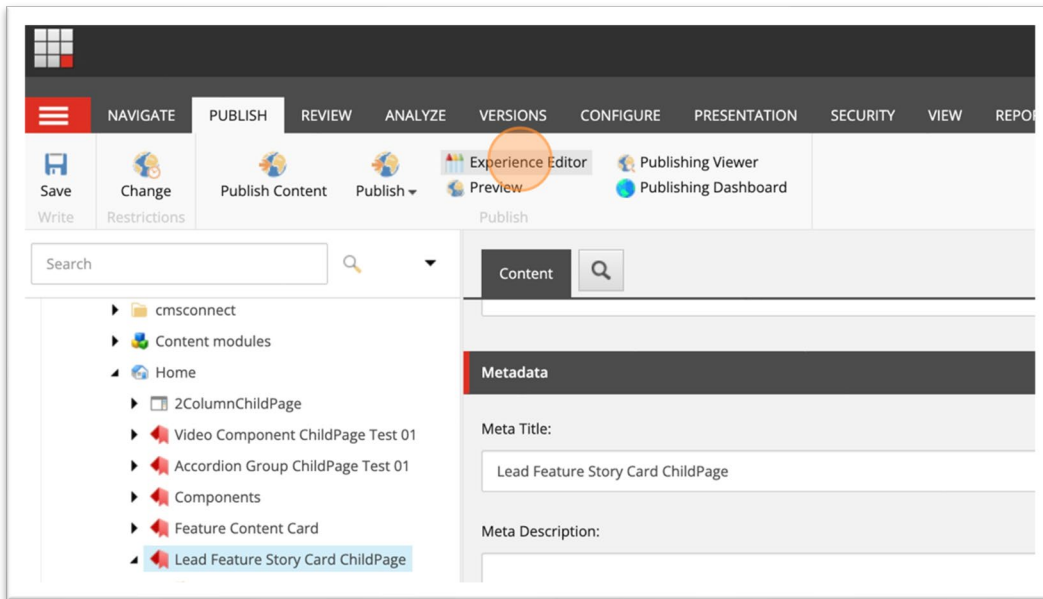
This guide walks you through adding a **Lead Feature Story Card** component using Sitecore's **Experience Editor**, after creating it in the Content Editor (see Part 1).

NOTE: the process to add the component to your page is not complete until you complete Part 2

Step 1: Open the Experience Editor

1. In the **Content Editor**, select the page you're working on.
2. Go to the **Publish** tab at the top and click **Experience Editor** to open it in a new browser tab.

Alternatively: You can also **right-click** the page in the content tree and select **Experience Editor** from the context menu.



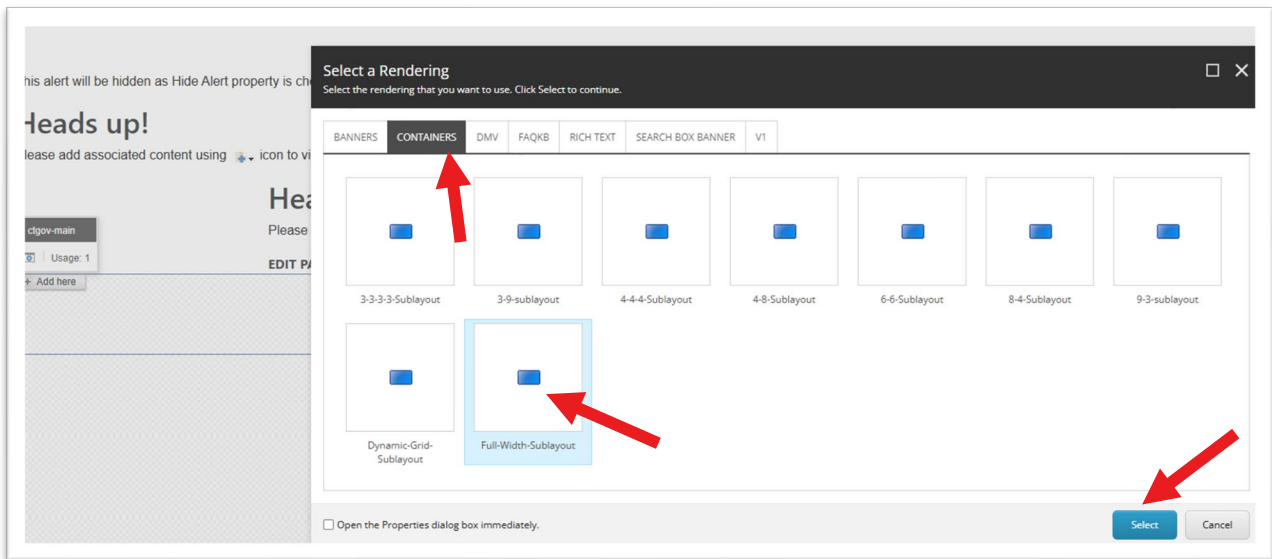
3. Wait for the Experience Editor page to **fully load** before proceeding.

Step 2: Add a Full Width Sub-layout

1. Click all the way to the left on the **empty placeholder box** where you want to insert your story card.
2. Click **Add here**



3. Click the **Containers** tab, then select **Full Width Sub-layout** and click **Select**.

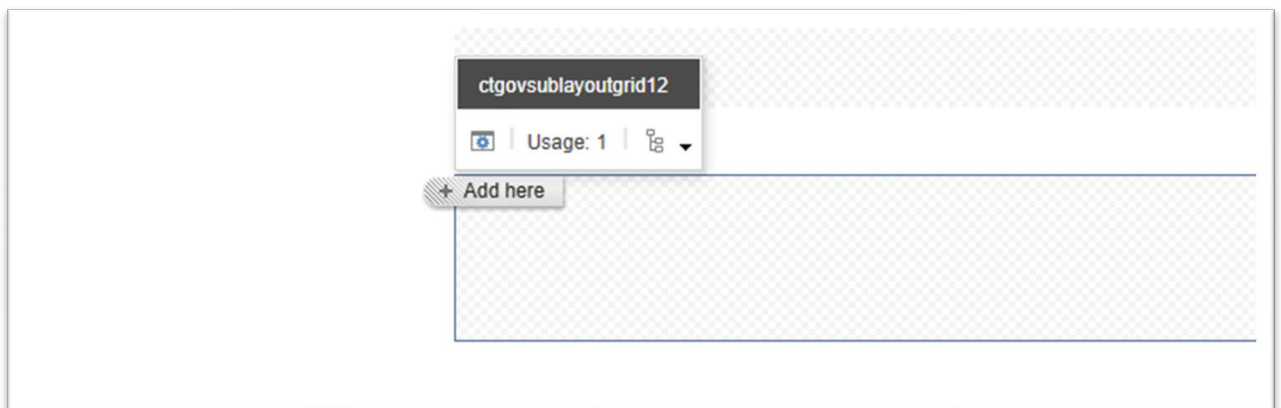


Note: For story groups in general, use either:

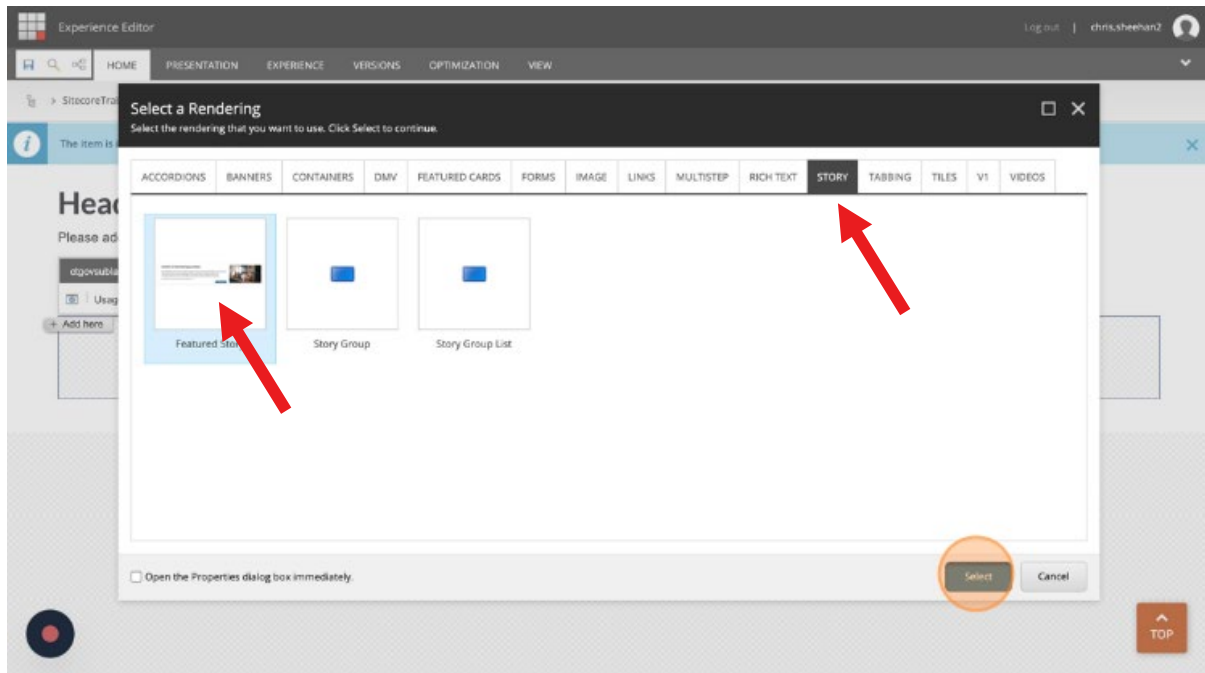
- **Full Width**
- **9 Columns**

Step 3: Add a Featured Story Component

1. Inside the new **rectangle placeholder**, click **Add here** again.

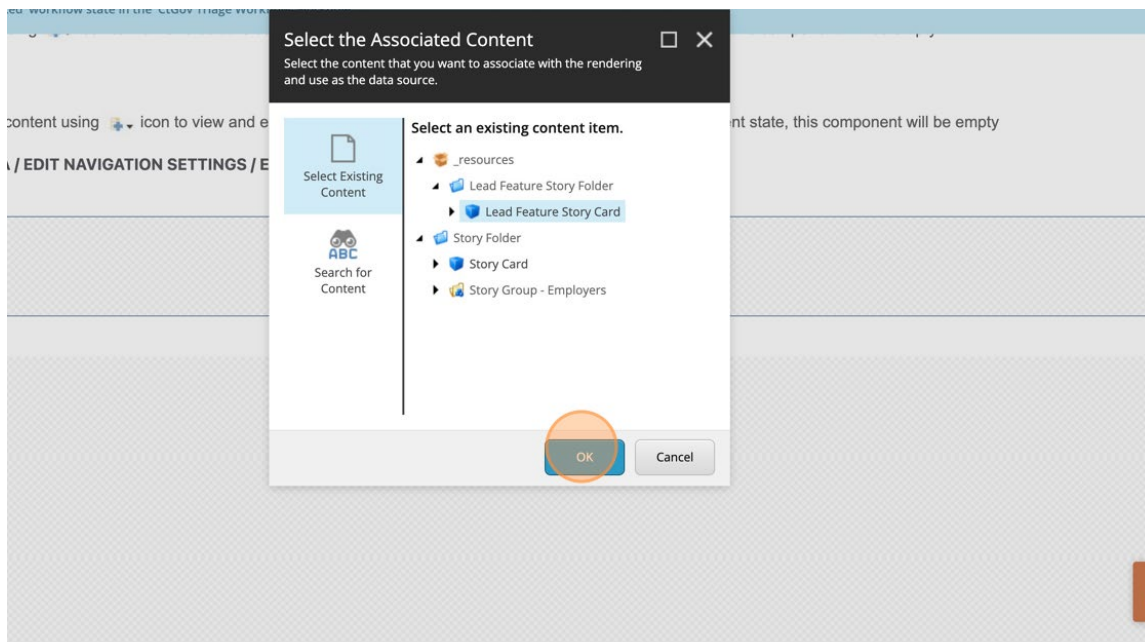


2. In the pop-up, choose the **STORY** tab.
3. Click **Featured Story**.
4. Click **Select** to continue.



Step 4: Link the Story Card

1. A new window will open. Find and expand the **Lead Feature Story Folder** (note: you may have titled it something different than this) you created earlier.
2. Select the **Lead Feature Story Card** (note: you may have titled it something different than this) you created.
3. Click **OK**.

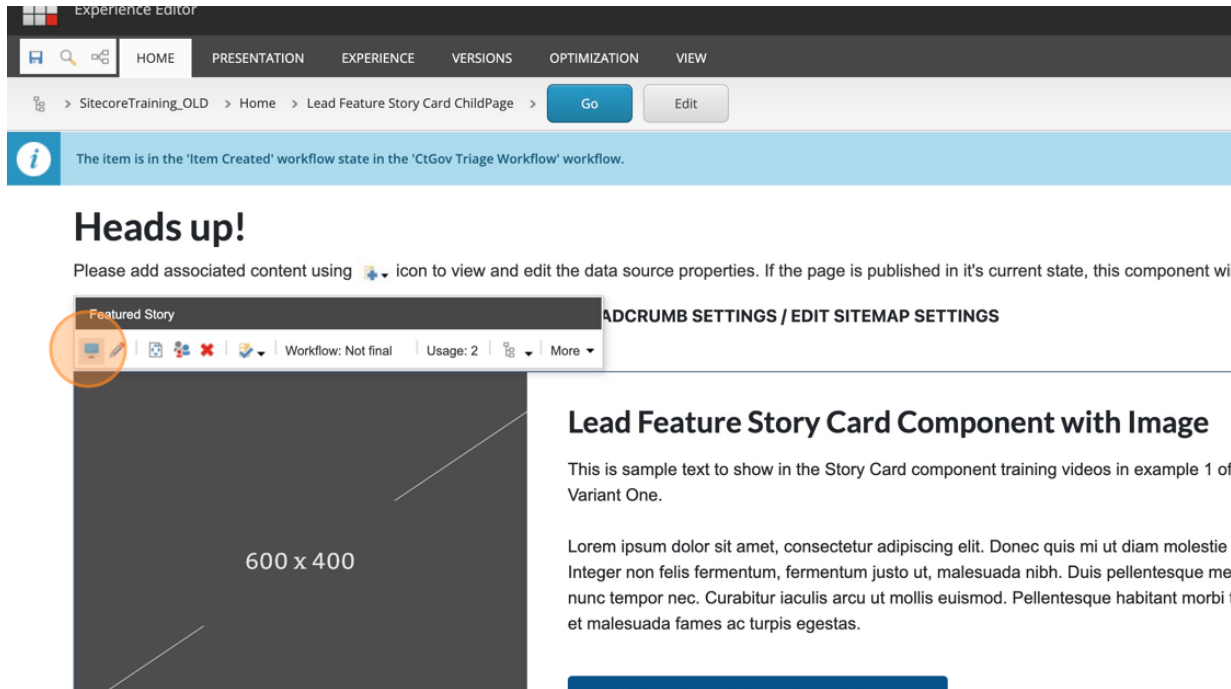


Your Story Card component should now appear on the page.

Step 5: Open the Component Properties

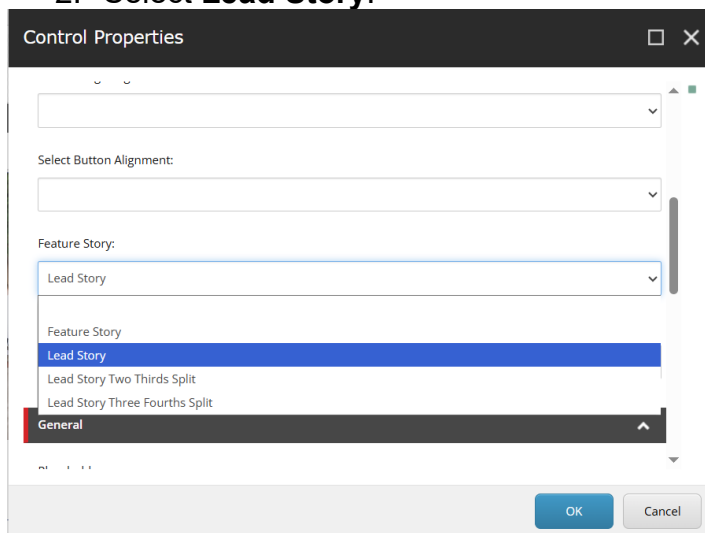
Your **Lead Feature Story Card** component has now been added to the default view on your page.

1. Then, click the **blue monitor icon** (highlighted below in the circle). Note: if it's not already displayed click the component to get it to display.
This opens the **Control Properties** menu, where you can adjust display settings.



Step 6: Choose Display Settings

1. In the Control Properties window, locate the **"Feature Story"** dropdown.
2. Select **Lead Story**.

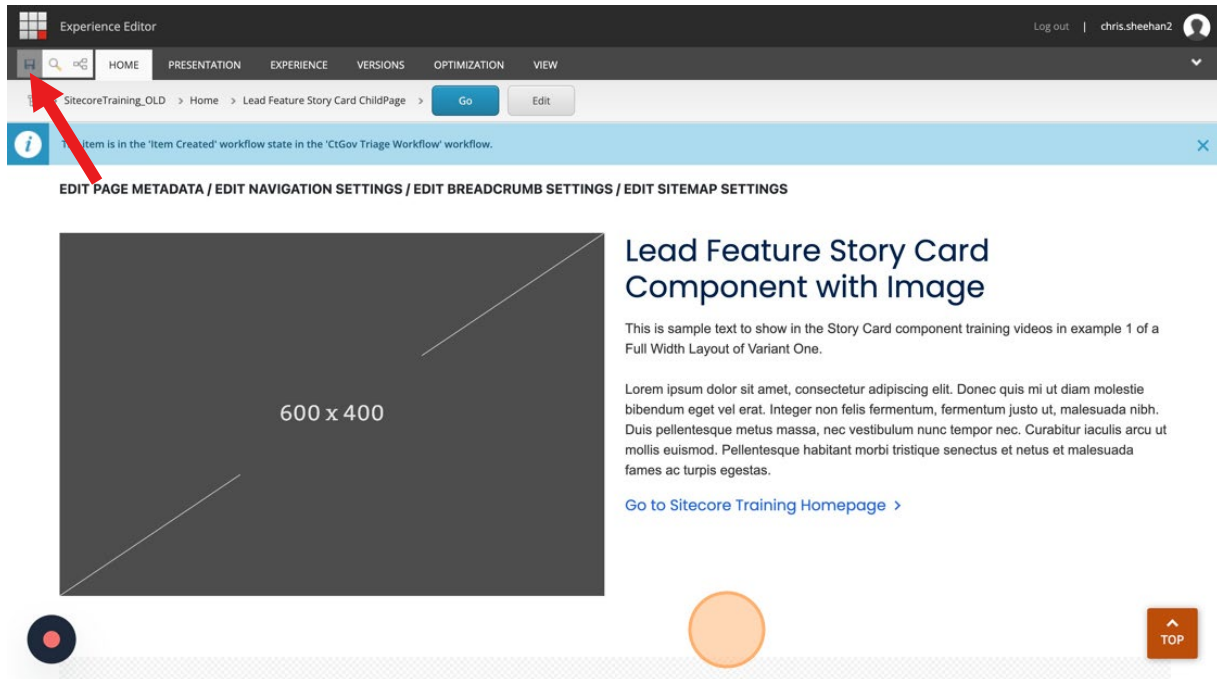


Optional display layout options

- **Lead Story Two Thirds Split** (4x8 Sub Layout in a Full Width Container)
- **Lead Story Three Fourths Split** (3x9 Sub Layout in a Full Width Container)

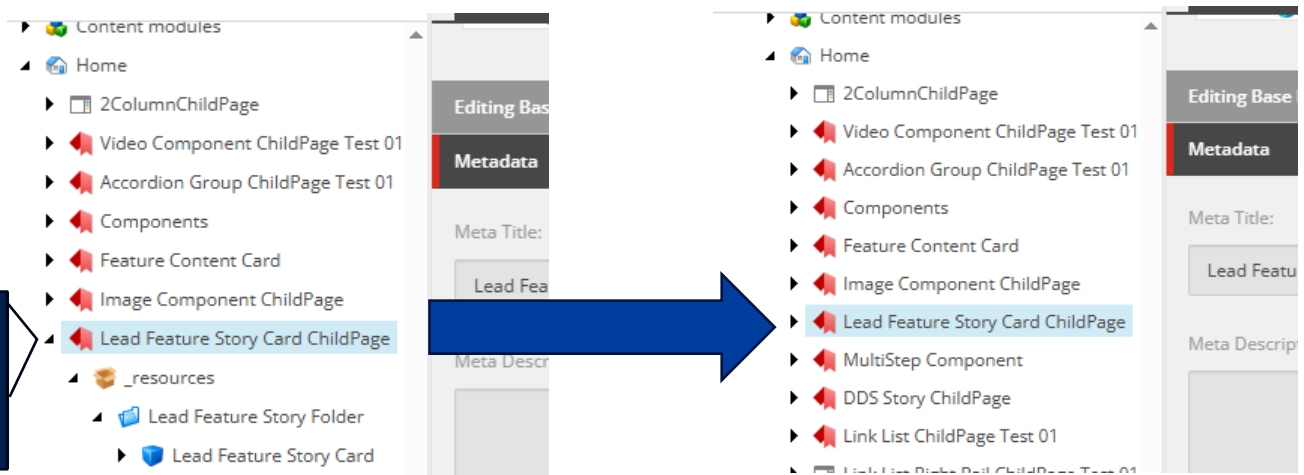
Step 7: Save Your Work in Experience Editor

1. After setting your layout, click the **Save (disc icon)** in the top left of the Experience Editor.
2. Wait for the page to **reload** fully.
3. Once reloaded, your page should show the lead feature story card, and the **Save icon will be grayed out**, confirming the changes are saved.



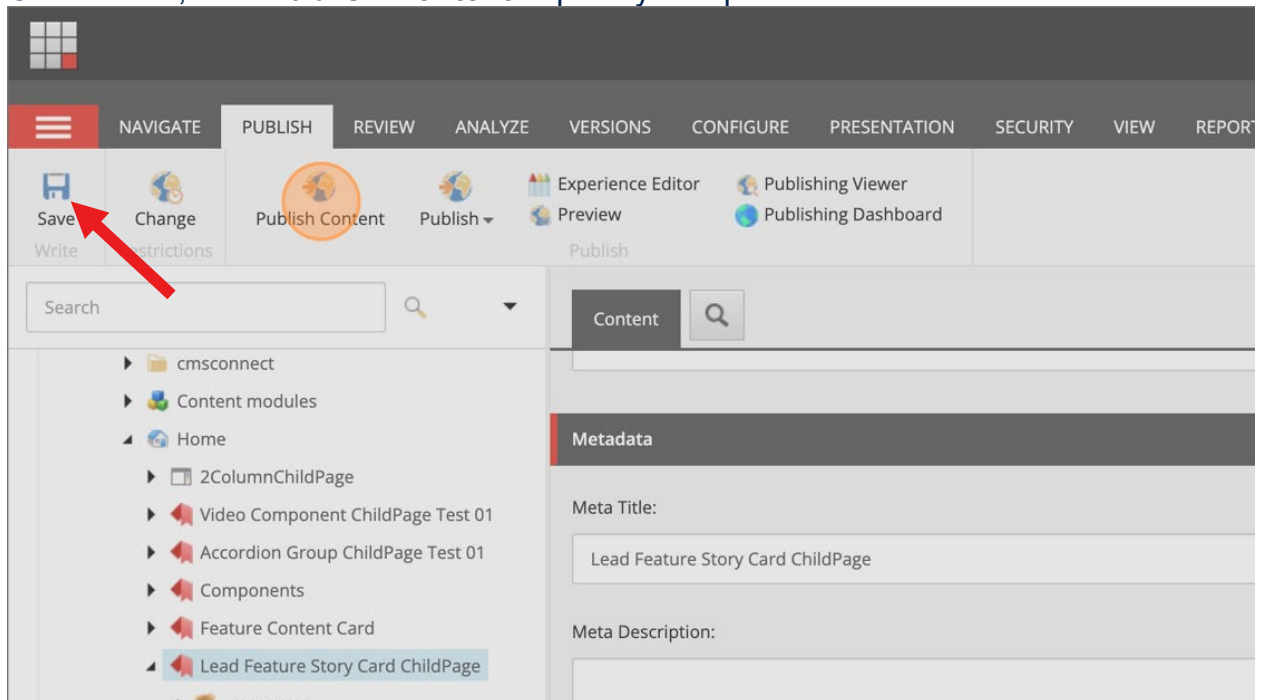
Step 8: Final Save in Content Editor

1. Return to the **Content Editor** (usually in the previous browser tab).
2. In the content tree, locate your **child page**.
3. To ensure Sitecore registers the changes you made in the experience editor, **collapse and re-expand** the page folder to refresh it.



Click the rectangle to collapse

4. Click the **Save** icon in the ribbon.
5. Once saved, click **Publish Content** to push your updates live.



6. Select your publishing targets and click Publish.
