CT Social Equity Council (SEC) Cannabis Study

The SEC was developed to make sure the adult-use cannabis program is grown equitably and ensures that funds generated are brought back to the communities hit hardest by the War on Drugs.

The research study seeks to understand the impact of cannabis criminalization on individuals as well as ways to reverse any negative impacts. This research study is conducted under the direction of the Institute for Municipal and Regional Policy at the University of Connecticut (Principal Investigator: Andrew Clark).
